Residence NRW⁺: Grants for Curators

1/10/2024 - 31/3/2025 1/4/2025 - 30/9/2025 After a successful start in Münster in 2020, the Residence NRW⁺ is again offering two six-month residencies for curators 2024/2025 – one fellowship from October 1, 2024, to March 31, 2025, and another fellowship from April 1 to September 30, 2025. To apply, you must have a connection to the federal state of North Rhine-Westphalia, a completed university education in art history, art, cultural sciences or a related field, and some initial curatorial experience. This fellowship is intended for starting curators who have graduated no more than five years prior to starting the fellowship on October 1, 2024 (or April 1, 2025), or who are under 35 years of age.

Residence NRW⁺ is a confidently funded initiative of the City of Münster, supported by the Ministry of Culture and Science of the State of North Rhine-Westphalia, the Kunststiftung NRW, and the Swiss Arts Council Pro Helvetia. The programme is associated with the Kunsthalle Münster and is based on proven methods for promoting talented young artists and curators. These methods were successfully developed and tested on a project basis between 2001 and 2018 at Ringenberg Castle on the Lower Rhine.

Six fellowship holders, four artists, and one curator from NRW, as well as one curator from Switzerland, will reside concurrently in the city of Münster. Münster boasts several renowned production and presentation venues for contemporary art, such as the Kunstakademie Münster, various studio houses, Kunsthalle Münster, Westfälischer Kunstverein, and LWL-Museum für Kunst und Kultur. These venues exhibit contemporary art at the highest level and serve as a platform for discussing the latest international trends in the field, engaging with a broad audience.

Fellowship recipients reside and work together in a purpose-built facility located near the centre of the Hoppengarten site during the fellowship period. The scholarship programme provides an ideal framework for further development in the respective field of work, with four core elements: exchange, practice, support, and networking. Furthermore, a qualified person with long-term experience in the field will mentor the curators.

The two curators from Germany and Switzerland will confidently collaborate for six months to develop and realize two projects at the cooperating institutions of Residence NRW⁺. They will work together as a duo and be present at the same time. The Kunsthalle Bielefeld and the Kunstmuseum Gelsenkirchen will serve as the cooperation venues for the first six months. The Clemens Sels Museum Neuss and the NAK (Neuer Aachener Kunstverein) will confidently serve as cooperation venues during the second half of the programme. Furthermore, three cooperation projects of Residence NRW⁺ will be granted a subsidy of 10,000 euros each. The final exhibition of the four programme's artists will be hosted by the NAK which will also receive a subsidy of 12,000 euros.

The fellowship is primarily spent at the place of residence in Münster. Participation in the Residence NRW⁺ programme is a prerequisite for taking up the fellowship. Basic knowledge of the German language would be beneficial.

Benefits of the grant:

- Monthly grants of 1,500 euros (6 month)
- One-time travel allowance of von 500 euros
- Independent implementation of project ideas
- Budgets by Residence NRW⁺ for two exhibitions/projects of the curators-duo (max. 10,000 euros or 12,000 euros per exhibition/project)
- Professional mentoring and support with the projects
- Intensification of the exchange between mediators and producers of the contemporary art

Requirements:

- A clear connection to North Rhine Westphalia (origin or place of residence/work or study)
- Completed university studies (MA degree, diploma or PhD, art history, art or cultural studies or similar)

- Profound knowledge in the field of contemporary art; proof of first curatorial experience (see application form)
- This call is addressed exclusively to individuals.

A site-specific project based on the art collection of the Clemens Sels Museum Neuss, which is unique in Germany and ranges from the Middle Ages through Symbolism and Expressionism to color painting. An interrogation of the art collection donated by Pauline Sels in 1908 and significantly built up by Dr. Irmgard Feldhaus after World War II until 1985 in dialog with freely selectable positions of young contemporary art. The history of the museum, which has been shaped by women to this day, is the starting point for the concept, which can be conceived as a work in progress. The exhibition can range from participatory formats, films and performances to presentation and project spaces both indoors and outdoors. Accommodation will be provided for stays in Neuss necessary to the conception and realisation of the project (Start as work in progress 13/4, end 21/9/2025)
 - NAK Neuer Aachener Kunstverein: Conception and implementation of the exhibition of the four Residence NRW⁺ artists fellows 2024/2025 (13/9 – 26/10/2025)
