Which courses do I have to take?



- Basically, the degree programme at the HFBK is divided into different courses: Modules and accompanying courses.
- All courses can be found in the course catalogue on our <u>website</u>. They are divided into the following **four** areas:

Modules "Introduction to Artistic Work"	Modules "Scientific Studies"	
= Foundation Year	= e.g. seminars, lectures etc	
Modules "Artistic Development Projects"	Accompanying Courses	
= artistic class including individual critiques	= foundation courses, practical courses, group critiques	





- In the 1st and 2nd semester (orientation phase), there is an introductory artistic module in each major. You complete this module as part of your foundation class.
- In the foundation classes, you will be intensively supervised by a professor during the first year of study.
- The work in the artistic classes consists of different teaching formats. For regular participation in both formats you will receive your credit points at the end of the semester for the module: "Introduction to artistic work".

Individual critique

= Individual meeting with your professor

Group critique

= Group discussion/class meeting with your fellow students, where you can talk about your artistic development plans.

You will be assigned to the foundation classes by lottery. It is therefore possible that your foundation class does not correspond to your desired department (interdisciplinary art education). You will only be assigned to a specific artistic class from the 3rd semester onwards.

"Artistic Development Projects" (3rd until 8th semester)

- The "Artistic Development Projects" are realised by you from the 3rd semester onwards in your artistic class under the supervision of your class professor.
- The work in the artistic classes consists of various teaching formats. For regular participation you will receive your credit points for the module: "Artistic Development Projects" at the end of the semester.

Individual critique

= Individual meeting with your professor

Group critique

- = Group discussion/class meeting with your fellow students, where you can talk about your artistic development plans.
- The dates and times for individual and group critiques by your class professor can be found in the current course catalogue. As a rule, you will also receive all the information you need from your professor and the tutors at the first meetings of your class!

"Scientific Studies" (1st until 8th semester)



- In the area of "Scientific Studies" you take one course of your choice per semester.
- The entire range of courses can be found in the course catalogue under the department "Theory and History".
- The teaching formats are quite different: for example, there are (block) seminars, lectures...etc.
- The type of examination (presentation, term paper, essay, project work) depends on the respective course and will be communicated to you by the teacher..

In the curriculum, "Scientific Studies" are compulsory from semester 1-7. In semester 8 you can then either take 1x "scientific studies" or alternatively two "accompanying courses".

Accompanying Courses (1st until 8th semester)



- The accompanying courses include practical courses and foundation courses.
- Practical courses usually offer both introductory courses and individual project work. You can receive credit points for both formats. Please refer to the course catalogue for more information!
- For some workshops, participation in an introductory course is a prerequisite for access (e.g. for safety reasons).
- Foundation courses are offered by the professors of the foundation classes and are open to students of all semesters.
- Important: From your 3rd semester onwards, group critiques of the artistic classes also count towards the accompanying courses. You can therefore also attend group critiques/events of other artistic classes and have the credits recognised.

Presentation of Coursework (End of 2nd semester)

- At the end of the 2nd semester, all Bachelor students present their coursework from the first and second semesters to an examination board. In the course of the presentation, students are also assigned to an artistic class from the 3rd semester onwards.
- The examination is compulsory and can be repeated twice. Repeat examinations must be taken at the next possible examination date (winter semester of a year).
- In order to register for the presentation of coursework, you must be able to prove a total of 28 credits in the Department of Student and Examination Affairs. Please find the link to the registration form here.
- You will receive 4 credits for successfully passing your coursework presentation. The examination itself is ungraded!
- You will receive information on the content of the presentation and organisation from your foundation class professor.

Curriculum Semester 3-7



- After the foundation year, the orientation phase ends and you will be assigned to a professor/artistic class.
- From now on, you will complete the module "Artistic Development Projects" within the framework of your artistic class, accompanied by your class professor.
- In a regular semester, you should complete courses worth 30 ECTS credits according to the following curriculum:

Curriculum for Semester 8



- In the 8th semester you will take one module from the area of "Artistic Development Projects" and two accompanying courses or alternatively 1 module from "Scientific Studies".
- The degree programme is completed with the Bachelor's thesis (final examination).
- The final examination is composed as follows:
 - a) Written Bachelor Thesis
 - b) Artistic Bachelor Thesis (presentation of the artistic work and colloquium)



Admission to the final examination



• Students who can demonstrate a total of at least 180 credits from the following areas are admitted to the theoretical and artistic Bachelor's thesis (final examination):



• The Bachelor's programme comprises a total of 240 credits. You will receive 18 credits upon successful completion of the final examination; if you have not already demonstrated more than the specified 180 credits at the time of registration, a further 42 credits must be earned from registration to the final examination in the following areas:



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Course registration



- Registration for courses takes place according to the teacher's instructions.
 There is no central online registration procedure for the allocation of places!
- Please consult the course catalogue for information on how to register for courses. You will usually find this information under or next to the individual contributions. Some lecturers require binding registration by e-mail, others post a list on their door for you to sign.
- **Important:** Many events, especially the workshop courses, have a **limited** number of participants. So please remember to register in good time.



Assessment of study and examination achievements


- As a general rule, all examinations at HFBK Hamburg are ungraded and are evaluated as "passed" or "failed".
- You have a total of three examination attempts.
- Only the final examination is graded and can be repeated once.

The Study Book



- The red study book serves as proof of your study and examination achievements. The complete registration and recognition of courses is done by the corresponding teacher and their personal signature.
- The study book will be handed out to you during the introductory events at the beginning of your studies.
- Please always remember to obtain signatures from the teachers in the last class of each semester.

Please take good care of your study book and keep it carefully! In case of loss or missing entries, it is your responsibility to reconstruct your study achievements and to subsequently obtain the entries from the responsible teachers.





BAföG (= Federal Training Assistance Act)

- The Studierendenwerk Hamburg is your contact for the application and granting of BAföG. Detailed information on this can be found at: https://www.stwhh.de/studienfinanzierung/bafoeg
- You will automatically receive the required so-called § 9 certificate together with your semester documents after transferring the semester fee. If you need a duplicate, please contact the Students Office during opening hours. Please note that a duplicate is subject to a charge (6 €).
- After the 4th semester, the BAföG office requires proof of a total of 120 credits.
 According to the study plan, you earn 30 credits per semester, so that you can show the required number of points. The confirmation is made exclusively on the basis of the red study book. For the issue of this § 48 certificate, which is required from the 4th semester onwards, please come to the Students Office during opening hours with your completed study book.
