(theoretical focus)

- Basically, the degree programme at the HFBK is divided into different courses: Modules
 and accompanying courses.
- All courses can be found in the course catalogue on our <u>website</u>. They are divided into the following **three** areas:

Compulsory module "Scientific and Artistic Development Projects"

= 1 course from "Theory and History"+ artistic class including individual critiques

Compulsory module "Theory and History"

= e.g. seminars, lectures etc...

Accompanying Courses

= Master colloquia, practical courses, group critiques

"Artistic Development Projects" for artistic focus (Semester 1 - 3)



- The "Artistic Development Projects" are realised by you in semester 1-3 in your artistic class under the supervision of your class professor.
- In Semester 1, you will concretise the artistic project with which you have applied for the Master's programme, under the guidance of your professor.
- At the end of the 1st semester, you present your project to your artistic class.
- The work in the artistic classes consists of various teaching formats. For regular participation you will receive your credit points for the module: "Artistic Development Projects" at the end of the semester.
- Individual critique
 - = Individual meeting with your professor

"Scientific and Artistic Development Projects" for theoretical focus (Semester 1 - 3)



- The module "Scientific and Artistic Development Projects" consists of one course from the area of "Scientific Studies" and one individual critique with an artistic class professor of your choice per semester.
- You can take the individual critique in any artistic department.

Compulsory module "Theory and History" (Semester 1 - 3)



- In order to pass the module, you take one course of your choice from the area of "Scientific Studies" per semester.
- You can find the entire range of courses in the course catalogue under the department "Theory and History".
- The teaching formats are quite diverse: for example, there are (block) seminars, lectures...etc.
- The type of examination (presentation, term paper, essay, project work) depends on the respective course and will be communicated to you by the teacher.

Accompanying Courses (Semester 1 - 3)



- The accompanying courses include practical courses and group critiques.
- Practical courses usually offer both introductory courses and individual project work. You can receive credit points for both formats. Please refer to the course catalogue for more information!
- For some workshops, participation in an introductory course is a prerequisite for access (e.g. for safety reasons).
- Group critiques are offered by all departments.
- Important: If you follow a theoretical focus, additional academic Master's colloquia are offered in the department Theory and History. Please find out from your respective professor which course work you need to complete for this.

Curriculum for Semester 4



- In the 4th semester you complete the final module (Master's thesis).
- The final examination is composed as follows:
 - a) Written Master Thesis
 - b) Artistic or artistic-scientific Master's thesis (presentation of the artistic or artistic-scientific work and colloquium)



The formalities for the Master thesis are regulated in the <u>examination</u> regulations. You can also obtain all organisational information on registration and the procedure from the Students Office.

Admission to the final examination



• Students who can demonstrate a total of at least 60 credits from the following areas are admitted to the theoretical and artistic Master's thesis (final examination):



• The Master's programme comprises a total of 120 credits. You will receive 30 credits upon successful completion of the final examination; if you have not already demonstrated more than the specified 60 credits at the time of registration, a further 30 credits must be earned from registration to the final examination in the following areas:



Course registration



- Registration for courses takes place according to the teacher's instructions.
 There is no central online registration procedure for the allocation of places!
- Please consult the course catalogue for information on how to register for courses. You will usually find this information under or next to the individual contributions. Some lecturers require binding registration by e-mail, others post a list on their door for you to sign.
- **Important:** Many events, especially the workshop courses, have a **limited** number of participants. So please remember to register in good time.



Assessment of study and examination achievements


- As a general rule, all examinations at HFBK Hamburg are ungraded and are evaluated as "passed" or "failed".
- You have a total of three examination attempts.
- Only the final examination is graded and can be repeated once.

The Study Book



- The red study book serves as proof of your study and examination achievements. The complete registration and recognition of courses is done by the corresponding teacher and their personal signature.
- The study book will be handed out to you during the introductory events at the beginning of your studies.
- Please always remember to obtain signatures from the teachers in the last class of each semester.

Please take good care of your study book and keep it carefully! In case of loss or missing entries, it is your responsibility to reconstruct your study achievements and to subsequently obtain the entries from the responsible teachers.
